Moravian Disaster Response to Hurricane Helene in North Carolina 10/18/24 UPDATE

The recovery effort from Hurricane Helene is in full swing in northwestern North Carolina, where the Board of World Mission is focusing our efforts. We are happy to report that Laurel Ridge, the Moravian Camp and Conference Center, now has power and will open Higgins Lodge beginning on October 18 for folks who would like to be part of the reconstruction effort. The BWM is helping to fund work being done at the home of

a 74-year-old woman in Lansing, NC. Her house was completely flooded and needs a complete rebuild. The Rev. Chris Thore is heading up work on this project and is especially in need of folks with carpentry, cabinetry, plumbing, and electrical skills. We are also interested in congregations or groups of congregations willing to come as mission teams to work either in the clean-up effort at Laurel Ridge or in the home of one of their neighbors. As you may know, each year the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce sponsors several Christmas Huts on Main Street. Again, this year, the Chamber has graciously offered one of the Huts to Bethlehem Emergency Sheltering and The Freezer Ministry and Garden Gatherers to help us spread the word about the important work that both groups do to address homelessness and hunger in our area.

We will be open additional weeks this year and will be offering free during November - cider and treats and December - hot chocolate and fresh-made cookies to our visitors on Main Street, as well as providing them with information about our organizations

In addition, musicians will be providing live seasonal music. This is such a plus to draw people to our Hut and help our causes. It is a joy to everyone who helps at the hut. To see dates and times of the musicians - 2024 Fluts Musicians.

Those that helped last year served over 4,000 individuals. This year we expect the number to top that, due to expanded hours and days.

The Hut, located on Main Street next to Central Moravian Church will be open:
- Nov. 15, 16, 17, 22, 23, 24, 29, 30 and Dec. 1, 6, 7, 8, 13, 14, 15, 20,21, 22.

We will be staffing the Hut - Friday 2:00-7:00, Saturday 1:30-7:00 and Sunday 1:00-5:00.

We are asking for help at the Hut for coordinators, setup, serving and information sharing. You may sign up for several slots if you prefer to stay longer. We are hoping for 2 reps from each organization per shift, but if you can only do a particular day and your organization's slot is full, you are welcome to take the other if open.

Your time at the Hut will help keep our community aware of the ever-present needs of our homeless and our hungry neighbors.

Bread Pudding with Vanilla Sauce

Ingredients

Bread Pudding:

- 3 cups whole milk
- 1 ½ cups white sugar
- ¼ cup butter, melted
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 2 tablespoons light brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 10 slices hearty farmhouse-style bread, toasted and cut into cubes
- 1 cup raisins

Vanilla Sauce:

- 1 ¼ cups whole milk
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 eqq
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 1 pinch ground cinnamon
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease a 2-quart baking dish.
- 2. For bread pudding, whisk together milk, sugar, melted butter, eggs, brown sugar, and cinnamon in a mixing bowl. Gently stir in bread cubes and raisins. Lightly spoon mixture into the prepared baking dish.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until browned and set in the middle, 50 to 55 minutes; cover the dish with foil after 30 minutes to prevent excessive browning. Let pudding stand for 10 minutes before serving.
- 4. For vanilla sauce, whisk together milk, brown sugar, butter, egg, flour, cinnamon, and salt in a heavy saucepan until smooth. Cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, until sauce is thickened and coats the back of a spoon, 10 to 12 minutes. Stir in vanilla extract.
- 5. Pour sauce over warm bread pudding or serve on the side in a bowl.
